



Top 20 States Grant Programs

Your guide to grant programs for the top 20 funded states.

Introduction

The top 20 states account for 75% of educational spending and state and federal grants. Just the top 5 states California, Texas, New York, Florida, and Illinois, account for over 35% of total grant funding. The top 5 states receive funding based on their large student enrollments and Title I allocations.

State Grant Opportunities

Each state has a variety of grant opportunities available to schools and school districts through both allocated and competitive grants. Visit your state's Department of Education (DOE) for information on specific state grant and federal sub-grant availability. Your State DOE will maintain a list of grants that are available along with a Request for Proposal (RFP) that must be completed. Completing a proposal to obtain a grant from your DOE is usually a straightforward process, as the RFP will guide you through the submission guidelines. Check the grants page on your DOE web site fairly frequently for the availability of new grants, or ask to be put on a grant notification list. Many of the states DOE Web sites have links to additional grant writing resources.

When completing a proposal in response to an RFP make sure that you follow the requirements exactly. Pay particular attention to deadlines, number of requested copies, and required signatures.

Enhancing Education through Technology Funding for the No Child Left Behind Act

The California Department of Education (CDE) will distribute approximately \$40 million to districts and eligible local partnerships in formula-funded grants through Title II, Part D, Enhancing Education through Technology. Approximately \$40 million will be available for competitive grants under Title II, Part D, Enhancing Education through Technology grants, subject to the enactment of state legislation to guide the competition. Districts should be aware that 25% of the funding must be spent on professional development related to helping teachers use technology as an effective tool to improve teaching and student achievement. The balance of the funding may be spent on education-technology expenses.

California Title I Funding

A school that implements a school wide program may use its Title I, Part A funds coupled with other federal education funds to upgrade the school's entire educational program. Targeted assistance services are provided to a select group of children - those identified as failing, or most at risk of failing, to meet the State Board of Education standards. Approximately 4,900 schools (58 percent) in 833 (83 percent) of California's school districts receive Title I funds.
