



Read Pearson eTextbooks in ePub format on the VitalSource® Bookshelf® using the Kurzweil 3000 Read the Web extension

You can now use the Kurzweil 3000 Read the Web extension to read ePub files on the VitalSource® Bookshelf® in Chrome or Firefox web browsers.

- Open the Chrome or Firefox browser.
- Login to your Kurzweil 3000 Read the Web extension.
- Login to: <https://bookshelf.vitalsource.com>.
- Open a book in your VitalSource® Bookshelf®.
- Click the cursor in the text where you want to start reading.
- Click the Read button in Kurzweil 3000 Read the Web to start reading.




Note:
Kurzweil 3000 Read the Web reads the main text of the book, but not areas outside of the book, such as the sidebars.

Edit underlying text in Kurzweil 3000 for Web Browsers (Kurzweil3000.com)


The Underlying Text button is now available in Kurzweil 3000 for Web Browsers.




When you find a word was not recognized correctly or is reading incorrectly, click the **Underlying Text** button to open the editing window and correct individual words in the underlying text.



In the top portion of the edit window, click on the word you want to change.
In the Selected Word field, type the word as you would like it to be spoken.



When you are finished making corrections, click the Underlying text button again and save your changes.




Download to multiple file formats from Kurzweil 3000 for Web Browsers (Kurzweil3000.com)


Use the Tools drop down menu to select from multiple file formats to download your file.

Old Tools Menu




Kurzweil 3000 for Web Browsers usability improvements


Responsive menu icons and mouse pointer, use of the Escape key to exit annotation mode, and larger menu icons to accommodate finger touch are now available.

When you click an annotation menu option such as highlighters or notes, the menu icon and mouse pointer change to reflect that choice. To return to Selection mode, hit the Esc key.
